Did God cry when He gave His only Son to die on the cross? I don't know but I'm sure he felt the pain of every nail that was hammered into Jesus' hands and feet. I'm sure he felt the agony of loss. But God endured the loss to fulfill the plan that gives hope to sinners everywhere. Jesus died the death we deserve and by believing in Him, we have the certain hope of eternal life. As we rejoiced over God's miracle and provision for Rod, another family was heartbroken over the death of someone they loved. But they were able to see through their sorrow and make the ultimate sacrifice of organ donation. Their tears of sadness mingled through our tears of joy. Their Good Friday became our Easter Sunday. A substitution was made.
